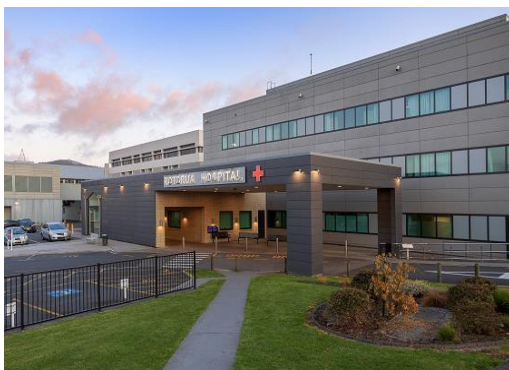

Late Starts

Late starts cannot be facilitated. Successful applicants are required to commence work at the start of the training year in January.

Rosters

Rosters vary across the specialties, however to give you an idea on average you will work:

Medical Runs –Most consist of

- 1 long day in 5
- 1 in 5 weekends (0800-2200)
- 2-3 sets of split nights per quarter
- Nights not worked in the first 6 months as a PGY1

Weekend Rosters

- Medicine – On average 1 in 3 weekends are rostered
- Surgery - On average 1 in 3 weekend are rostered
