Surgical Runs – Most consist of

Most of the rosters work to a predictable template to help you to plan your life outside work.

Some services have their own specific house officer rosters, while other services, e.g. specialties of internal medicine, have generic rosters in which the house officers cover all of the patients in those specialties.

Out of hours, house officers are supported by the SMO and registrar on their team, as well as by the Clinical Team Coordinators (CTCs). CTCs are senior nurses, usually with experience in ED or ICU, who are able to offer advice, triage calls and ensure that everyone shares evenly in the work to be done.

There is no need to feel alone out of hours, as help is always close at hand.
