Rosters

Rosters vary across the specialities however to give you an idea:

- 1 long day per week (Mon - Fri 0800 - 2230)
- 1 weekend day every 2 – 3 weeks (0800 - 2230)
- Split nights (4 /3)
- Rosters are in compliance with the Schedule 10 Safer Rosters

Rosters

Rosters vary across specialties however to give you an idea:

 - Long days – up to one per week
 - Weekends – approximately 2 -3 per quarter
 - No nights
- PGY1 in second 6 months will work:
 - Less long days and weekends nights
